## **NIRIMBA COLLEGIATE - PROPOSAL FOR FUTURE EDUCATION PROVISION**

At a recent P & C meeting. Ms Downie outlined a proposal being developed by the leadership of the Nirimba Collegiate to significantly expand so as to be able to offer greater and more flexible learning opportunities for our students.

We are currently formulating a proposal for the future education provision in the North West region in order to provide more options to our students for their Year 11 and 12 studies.

The proposed model significantly expands our collegiate, with Quakers Hill, Riverstone and Seven Hills High Schools becoming a full 7-12 campuses and Wyndham College retaining its status as a Years 11 and 12 campus.

In order to further develop the proposal, we are undertaking some research with assistance from the NSW Department of Education's Communication and Engagement team. The research involves small group discussions, which provide an opportunity for you to share your thoughts on education in the senior years for your child and give your opinion on different aspects of the proposed changes.

As parents and caregivers, we value your input on how we can continue to best meet the needs of our students in the senior years of their high school education.

Your opinions, comments and feedback will be considered as we continue to develop the proposed model.

A parent discussion group will take place in the library on Tuesday, 30 October from 3.00 pm to 4.00 pm.

### **YEAR 8 SCIENCE**

Year 8 Science students will be sitting the VALID Science 8 test on Week 4 this term. It is a State test which is an interactive, multimedia test and is completed on a computer. The test is composed of multiple choice, short response and extended response tasks and testing skill and understanding of Science. Each student needs to bring headphones or earbuds that will plug into a school computer. Class 8 O students will be sitting the test on Monday 5 November and the remainder of Year 8 will be sitting the test on Tuesday 6 November periods 1 and 2.

## **SCHOOL VACCINATION PROGRAM VISIT**

Tuesday 30<sup>th</sup> October is the 3rd visit to see Year 7 students and also catch-up with some Year 8 & 10 students. Year 7 students will be given the final dose of HPV vaccine.

Any students who have not yet started the program can commence at this visit, this will be their “Last chance” to join the Year 7 program (HPV will be completed during 2nd Visit 2019)

Year 8 students will be offered a catch-up vaccination for 2nd dose HPV.

Year 10 students absent on the last Vaccination date will be provided meningococcal ACWY vaccine.

In addition, NSW Health has extended the age group who can get this vaccine for free at the GP (if they have not received it at school).

**The meningococcal ACWY vaccine is now available for 15-19 year olds until the end of 2018.**
