Riverstone High School

<u>Animated</u>

Lead Teacher | Mr Simpson

Maximum Group Size 15

What is this project about?

Ever watched movies like The Boxtrolls and The Nightmare before Christmas and wondered how they were made? Have you wondered how to bring your stories to life. In this PRIDE project, you will learn the basics of Claymation – animations made with plasticine. They will design and create a stop-motion animation in pairs or small groups on a chosen theme.

What will your outcomes be?

- Develop skills to create Claymation animations.
- Develop skills in constructing narratives, camera craft and video editing.

What impact will it have on the school or community?

Students have an opportunity to expand and express their creativity in new ways and collaborate with their peers.

What will you create?

• A viewing of the completed stop-motion animations Tropfest style, with a panel of judges to determine the winner.

<u>How long will this go for?</u>

Bicycle Recycle

Lead Teacher Miss Williams Maximum Group Size 15

What is this project about?

Do you want to learn how to fix up that old bike rusting away in the garage+ Would you like to learn how to make repairs to your own bike? Maybe you're already an expert bike repairer and you would like to share your skills! In our Bicycle Recycle project we will be sourcing donated, pre-loved bikes that are in need of fixing up. Once you've got them back in working order, we will be donating them to members of our community.

What will your outcomes be?

- Students will develop skills in bicycle repair and maintenance
- Students will learn about ways to promote recycling, sustainability and healthy living.

What impact will it have on the school or community?

Through the Bicycle Recycle program, students will learn practical bicycle repair skills, including how to use tools appropriately. Students will need to work together and employ a respectful and cooperative attitude. The aim is to partner with The Riverstone Men's Shed to recycle and distribute the refurbed bikes.

What will you create?

What is this project about?

Using the game making software UNITY, you will learn how to design a professional game suitable for the play store. You learn to read and write code, design 3D graphics and test games. The Unity® Experiments are a series of challenging coding and game development activities which utilise Unity®, the world's most popular game engine. Rather than following a tutorial designed to recreate a specific type of game, The Unity Experiments will teach you specific coding and game design concepts which can be combined to create your own unique projects.

What will your outcomes be?

- You learn to use code to create engaging games to be played by their peers and the public.
- Design a game that can be easily downloaded and played at an expo night and in general everyday life.

What impact will it have on the school or community?

With the ever increasing amount of young people engaging in gaming, it has become an increasingly popular and lucrative industry. Designing games using industry standard software will open you up to opportunities and career paths in the future that are aligned with 21st century learning.

What will you create?

A game that is available to be downloaded and played at an expo night.

How long will it go for?

Terms 3 & 4- 20 Weeks

Claying Around

What is this project about?

You will design, create and make a range of objects from clay. This will include objects you can use around the home, wear and objects for display. You will learn a range of techniques and skills to successfully form 3D clay items. We could even have a market at a lunch time where we could sell some of the objects we make.

What will your outcomes be?

- Developing clay and ceramic skills.
- Provide opportunities for self-expression.
- Production products for sale

What impact will it have on the school or community?

This project allows participants to work hands on to produce clay and ceramic products which can be displayed or sold. Money raised could be donated to a local charity.

What will you create?

• Clay and ceramic products for display

How long will this go for?

Crochet for a Cause

What is this project about?

This project is all about supporting the youngest members of our society. You will crochet a toy Octopus to help Premature babies. Why you might ask? Doctors believe that the tentacles of the crochet Octopus remind these young babies of the umbilical cord, which in turn reminds them of being in their mother's womb, creating a sense of safety and comfort.

What will your outcomes be?

- Improved crochet skills.
- Create toys for premature babies.

What impact will it have on the school or community?

The toys created will be donated to a local Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. These toys will be donated to babies and their families to support them while the child is in the NICU. These toys will also provide safety and comfort to the infant which should help aid their well-being as they develop.

What will you create?

How long will this go for?

What will your outcomes be?
